



## Chairman's Report 2020

It is also a strange time to be holding our AGM. It should have been in April, but we decided to defer it until we could all meet again in person, but the sad and unexpected death of Barbara has made a meeting now essential. The Club must have a Secretary and with Liz Cable and me having already announced that we are standing down from the Committee there simply are not enough remaining members of the Committee to reallocate Barbara's roles.

Of course Barbara was so much more than our Secretary. She provided a vital energy to the Club which will be difficult to replace and her untimely death has denied us the opportunity to thank her properly for all that she has done for us over so many years. She will be sorely missed on many levels.

Important although Barbara's contribution has been nothing is ever achieved in isolation, and it is a vital part of my role as Chairman to acknowledge the contribution of everyone who has allowed the Club to operate throughout what has undoubtedly proved to have been a difficult year.

I could start to try and name them all but I'm sure to miss someone and cause offence. The role of some is obvious when they are on the Committee, so I will thank all who have served with me over the past year; Colin, Davina, Joan and Liz.

It is also customary at the AGM to present our trophies, and whilst I cannot do so this year in person I can announce the results of our two competitions.

**The Wilson Trophy** – awarded to the individual member with the highest average across their 20 best scores during the year, subject to playing a minimum of 30 sessions:

3<sup>rd</sup> – Elizabeth Copeman with an average of 61.96%, narrowly beating Mary Forristal who averaged 61.65%

2<sup>nd</sup> – Ashok Parikh with an average of 62.31%

1<sup>st</sup> – John Spiers with an average of 63.81%

Overall it is the same three members who occupied the three top spots in 2019. It is only the order that is reversed.

**The Redmen Trophy** – awarded to the top scoring team in our winter teams competition. Again there were only 4 teams taking part and the winners were Viv, Elizabeth Yuki and Jacqui, with a 46 – 40 margin over last year's winning team of Wendy, Iris, Hilary and Joan.

It will be for a new committee to take the Club forward in these uncertain times but I know that they will want to see everyone playing face to face again in Busbridge as soon as it is considered safe to do so. I look forward to seeing you then.
